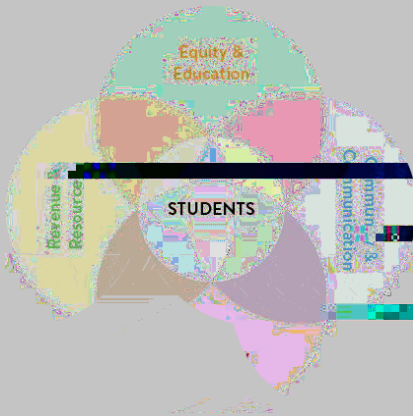

Wednesday, Oct. 16, 7 p.m., Smithwick Theatre

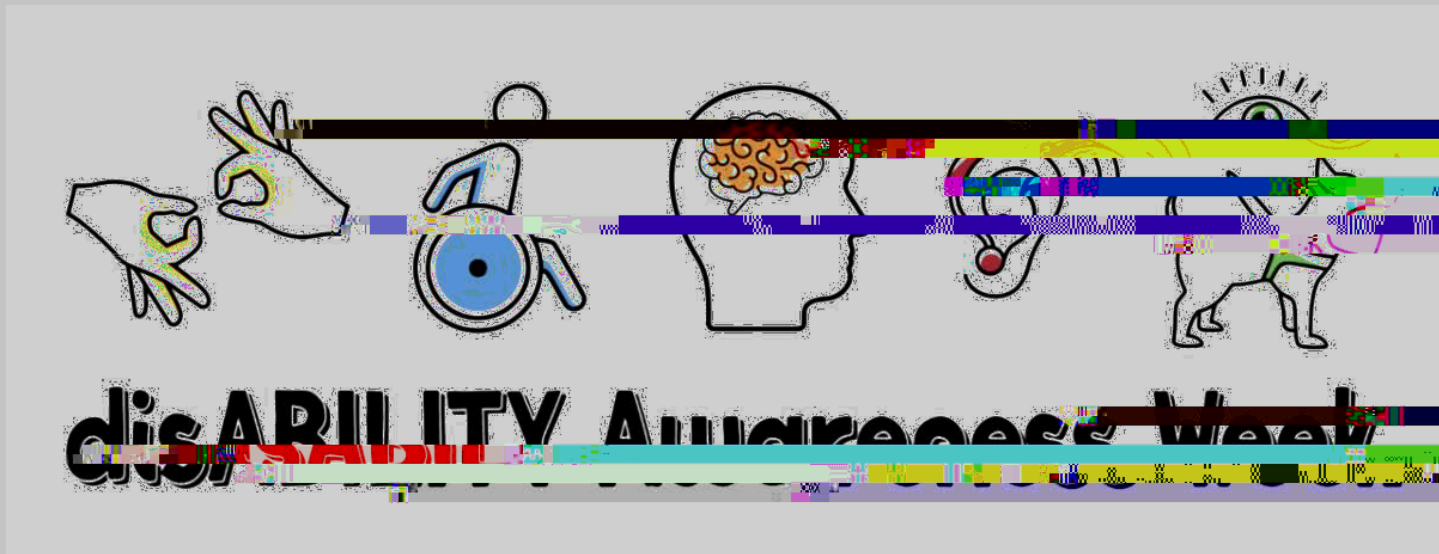
After a successful encounter with Pluto, the New Horizons spacecraft flew by a member of the Kuiper Belt of icy objects beyond Neptune. This particular object, officially called 2014MU69, but informally named "Ultimate Thule" (meaning the farthest place beyond the known world) turned out to be a "contact binary" - two smaller icy worlds stuck together. Dr. Jeff Moore from NASA will share how the
